Apollo High School Guidance and Counseling Department has adopted the National Comprehensive Competency-Based Guidance model (CCBG).

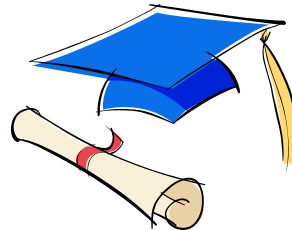
